

Sports Premium 2015-16

In the financial year 2015-16 Hurst Hill Primary School will receive £9,345 of Sports Premium Funding. We are using the Sports Premium to run competitions and sporting activities at lunchtimes and after school provided by professional sports coaches from our established partners at Sportsplus Ltd.

Provision

Thanks to our partnership with Sportsplus:

60 free places continue to be provided for after school sports clubs every term.

Every pupil continues to have 2 hours designated PE/Sport tuition per week with one of those hours delivered by a Sportsplus coach.

Pupils take part in a wide range of sports activities including swimming, dance, tag rugby, gymnastics, speed stacking and bikeability as well as more traditional activities such as netball, football, tennis, cricket and rounders.

Sportsplus are setting up a school football team.

Every KS2 pupil has now had the opportunity to participate in free, accredited Bikeability training.

Every child continues to be provided with free swimming tuition for at least one term in lower KS2.

The school has used some of the grant money to pay for new Playground equipment to keep the children entertained to encourage them to play games together.

Impact

The school now holds a Youth Sports Trust Bronze Award and continues to be a member of the trust.

Analysis of behaviour logs from September 2014 indicates a consistently improving trend. In particular, older boys with identified behavioural, emotional and social difficulties are involved in an ever-decreasing number of negative behaviour incidents which we attribute in part to their energies being productively channelled into sport over lunchtime.

Throughout the year, with our full support, a Year 5 pupil continues to attend the West Bromwich Albion Football Academy day release programme having been talent spotted by the club.
