Compose	Order the notes to make your own melody
Melody	Notes put together to make a piece of music.
Tempo	Music speed
Dynamics	The change in volume in the music
Tuned instrument	An instrument which plays different notes
Untuned	An instrument that only plays one note.
Notation	Writing the notes on the page



### Key Skills and Knowledge

**Listen and Appraise** — Can I take it in turn to discuss how the song makes them feel?

Can I listen carefully and respectfully to other people's thoughts about the music?

**Musical games** — Can I create your own simple rhythm patterns?

Can I copy back with instruments, without then with notation?

**Learn to sing** — Can I demonstrate a good singing posture?

Can I follow a leader when singing?

Can I enjoy exploring singing solo?

**Learn to play** — Can I play any one, or all of four, differentiated parts on a tuned instrument?

**Improvise** — Can I listen and copy back using instruments, using two different notes?

Can I use instruments, listen and play your own answer using one or two notes?

**Compose** — Can I help create at least one simple melody using one, three or five different notes?

Can I plan and create a section of music that can be performed within the context of the unit song?

Can I talk about how it was created?

**Perform** — Can I choose what to perform and create a programme? Can I talk about the best place to be when performing and how to stand or sit?
