**Rights and responsibilities:** contributing to life in the classroom; constructing and following rules; awareness of needs of people and other living things; belonging to communities and groups

Key vocabulary:

Well-being— the state of being comfortable, healthy, or happy .

Anti-social- contrary to the laws and customs of society, in a way that causes annoyance and disapproval in others.

Rights- legal, social, or ethical principles of freedom or entitlement.

Responsibilities- being accountable or to blame for something.

Environment- the surroundings or conditions in which a person, animal, or plant lives

Debt- a sum of money that is owed or due .

Interest- money paid regularly at a particular rate for the use of money lent.
