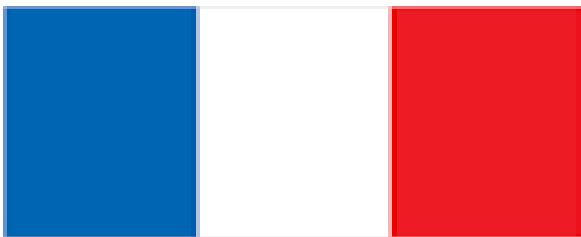

Capital letters

Phonics and pronunciation
Pronounce the phoneme [w] and recognise its grapheme 'oi', as in poisson, bois, trois and toile. Know that In English, the grapheme 'oi' is pronounced [ɔɪ] as in oil, boil and soil.
