

### Literacy

- Continuing phase 4 phonics
- Continuing to blend and segment words to read and spell, including compound words and root words with different endings
- Learning new phase 4 tricky words (words we can't sound out)
- Learning a range of traditional tales
- Writing for a range of purposes including letters, character descriptions and retelling parts of a story
- Writing and reading simple sentences with capital letters and full stops
- To practise forming all lowercase and uppercase letters
- Answering comprehension questions

### Understanding the World

- Exploring and following maps
- Growing beanstalks and exploring the life cycle of a plant
- Looking at similarities and differences of homes in the past compared to the present day
