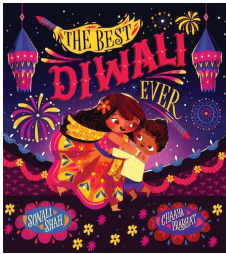
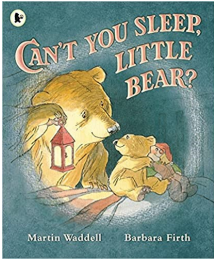

Key Vocabulary

Diwali- is the five-day, religious Hindu and Sikh festival of lights.



Poppy – the red poppy is worn on Remembrance Day, as a show of support for the armed forces community.



Diva- is an oil lamp usually made of clay, with a cotton wick dipped in ghee. Lit to celebrate Diwali.



Christmas – is annual festival, celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ.



Bonfire night – a night on which bonfires are lit in memory of the gunpowder plot.



Christingle – is a symbolic object used in the advent, Christmas services. It is used to celebrate Jesus as the light of the world.



Remembrance Day – is a Memorial Day to remember the lives lost during the first world war



Nativity- the birth of Jesus, celebrated by Christian's at Christmas time.

Bonfire night – 5th November

Remembrance Sunday – 7th November

Diwali – 3rd/4th/5th November

Christingle – Early December

Christmas – 25th December
