Rights and responsibilities: issues concerning health and wellbeing; the purpose of rules and laws; human rights; different cultures, customs and traditions of people living in the UK; anti-social behaviours and their consequences; difference between rights and responsibilities; resolving differences; critiquing media information

Taking care of the environment: taking care of the environment; our responsibilities towards our environment; being part of a community; different groups that support our communities and environment; the lives of other people around the world; how resources are allocated to communities

Money matters: the role that money plays in their lives; borrowing, debt and interest; enterprise

Key vocabulary:

Human rights- a right which is believed to belong to every person

Anti-social behaviours- behaviour by a person which causes, or is likely to cause, harassment, alarm or distress to another person

Responsibilities- the state or fact of being accountable or to blame for something.

Community- a group of people living in the same place or having a particular characteristic in common.

Finance- the management of money and includes activities like investing, borrowing, lending, budgeting and saving.
