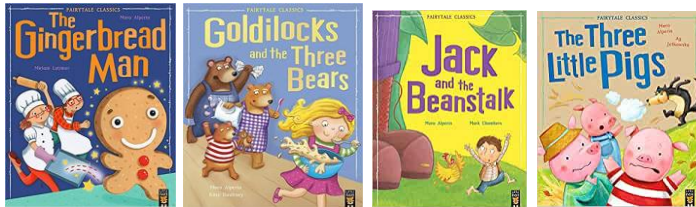




# Autumn term 1 - Once upon a time and rhyme

## Key Vocabulary

Story: A collection of words with a clear beginning, middle and end.



Bear – a large strong powerful animal, can be white, brown or black in colour



Rhyme means words that sound the same or similar in their endings



Autumn is one of the four seasons of the year; it follows Summer and comes before Winter



Author is the person who writes the story



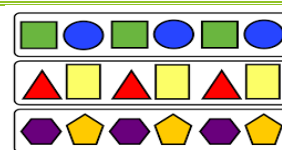
Rosh Hashanah is the Jewish New Year festival and lasts for two days



Illustrator is the person who draws the pictures in the story



Repeating pattern – patterns where a group of elements repeat themselves as the pattern extends
