Children’s questionnaire results

96% of pupils feel safe at school.

93% of pupils say that if there is any bullying, it is dealt with properly.

92% of pupils say that my school provides me with appropriate information for my next steps.

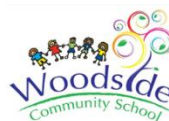
Parent questionnaire results

Please continue to view our weekly school newsletter for all new events this term. Also, don't forget the new after school clubs list, for extra-curricular clubs for your children.

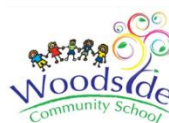
