We are delighted to share some of the ways we ensure a welcoming and enriching environment for your children at our school. Each morning, our staff greet the children at the classroom door, and a senior leader is present to welcome them at the start and end of the school day.

Our lessons are designed to be engaging for all pupils, and we plan various trips and visits to enrich the curriculum for each year group. Throughout the year, we also organise several enrichment days, such as World Book Day and Skills Builder Challenge Days, to engage the pupils and promote essential skills.

- 2. **Positive Reinforcement**: After each drill, we praise the children for their participation and bravery, highlighting how well they followed instructions and how their actions contribute to everyone's safety.
- 3. **Parental Involvement**: We encourage you to discuss the importance of these drills at home and reassure your children. A consistent message from both school and home can be very comforting.

By continuing to listen to the children's concerns and providing them with clear, consistent information, we aim to build their confidence and sense of security.

94% of parents said that their child is well looked after at this school.

99% of children said that they are well looked after at school and can talk to an adult if something is worrying them.

At our school, we prioritise the safety and well-being of every pupil. Here's how we do it:

For our Early Years pupils, we use **Tapestry** as a key tool to keep you updated on your child's learning journey. You can also use Tapestry to add any home learning activities to their journal.

96% of children said that they get to take part in a good range of subjects in school.

At Hurst Hill, we offer a diverse curriculum to ensure your child receives a well-rounded education. Our subjects include:

- Phonics, Reading, and Writing
- Maths and Science
- History and Geography
- Computing and Religious Education (RE)
- Relationships, Sex, and Health Education (RSHE)
- Art and Design Technology
- Physical Education (PE) and Music
- Skills Builder (essential life skills to develop the whole child)

Currently, our Year 3 pupils are enjoying recorder lessons. Additionally, in Key Stage 2, children will learn Spanish and have the chance to participate in swimming lessons.

83% of parents said that school makes sure its pupils are well behaved.

98% of children said that behaviour of other pupils in lessons and around school is good.

We are proud to share that visitors to Hurst Hill frequently praise our pupils for their excellent behaviour and positive attitudes. Our school has clear behaviour policies, rules, and rewards in place to encourage all pupils to do their best. 36% of parents said that school deals with bullying quickly and effectively and 56% of parents said that their child has never been bullied.

34% of children say that teachers are good at resolving any bullying quickly, 63% of our pupils say that bullying doesn't happen.

Our school has a clear anti-bullying policy and trained staff to handle incidents effectively. We provide support for all pupils involved and keep parents informed. Our school values promote positive school culture and this year we are aiming to achieve the super kind schools award. At Hurst Hill Primary, the Junior Leadership Team plays a significant role in fostering personal development among pupils. This team includes various roles such as Digital Leaders, Well-Being Ambassadors, and Healthy Eating Ambassadors. The Junior Leadership Team at Hurst Hill Primary includes pupils from Reception to Year 6, giving all pupils a chance to develop their leadership skills from an early age. This inclusive approach ensures that even the youngest pupils can participate and contribute to the school community. We are supported in lessons through Skills Builder where pupils develop their Speaking, Listening, Creativity, Problem Solving, Staying Positive, Aiming High, Leadership and Teamwork skills.
